### **Coffee Gold Project** **Kaminak Gold Corporation (KAM: TSX-V)**

Located in the emerging, White Gold District of the Yukon, the Coffee Project is an early-stage gold project identified the old fashion way, boots-on-the ground prospecting, and advanced by soil-sampling and trenching. Multiple surface gold discoveries were made in 2009 warranting a diamond drill program that will kick-start the 2010 field season on this never before drill tested Canadian gold project.

With only 20% of the 19,900 hectares property having been soil-sampled, eight gold zones over a 11 km strike length have been identified on the Coffee Project, and only four of these zones have seen limited trenching. Select trench assays include: **11.72 g/t Au over 10m, 8.56 g/t Au over 15m, 2.30 g/t Au over 21m, and 1.37 g/t Au over 30m.**

In addition to these trench assays, soil samples have yielded up to 3.16 g/t Au, grab samples up to 3.9 g/t have been collected and a new White Gold District host rock has been identified on the Coffee property, Cretaceous-aged granite.

A summary of the work and results, *intended to stimulate discussion of future efforts on the project*, will be presented.
